The Washington Heights native has been a key cog in the Lightning's recent surge in the conference standings. The 5-8 point guard averaged 18.0 points (45 percent field goal percentage), 5.0 rebounds, and 4.0 assists in Lehman's 3-0 week. The Norman Thomas graduate, who connected on 10-of-22 three-point field goals during the stretch, scored 24 points (6-f-of-7 three point field goals) in the road victory at John Jay (2/2). She also added 10 points, six rebounds, and six assists in the road win at CUNYAC South Division leader Staten Island (1/31). She closed out the week with 20 points versus Morrisville (2/3).

FLUSHING/QUEENS, NY

The Queens native recorded back-to-back monster performances in conference wins against York (1/31) and City Tech (2/2), averaging 24.5 points, 17.0 rebounds, and 4.0 steals per game. The 5-10 forward recorded 24 points and added 13 boards and seven steals in the 55-40 win at York. The Flushing graduate followed that up with 25 points and 21 rebounds in the 72-60 at home versus City Tech. The freshman currently leads the CUNYAC in rebounding (11.6 rpg.), is fifth in scoring (15.4 ppg.), and is tied for the league-league with 14 double-doubles.

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TEAM NOTES

CITY TECH

Sophomore forward Kemi Owoseni scored in double figures in each of the Yellow Jackets two games last week with 12 points against New Jersey City and 15 versus Hunter. Junior guard Mareena Creary also scored 13 to lead City Tech against NJCU, while sophomore guard Dyshea Smiley added 13 points in the Hunter game. Senior guard Tamika Willis will be honored for four years of committed service to the Yellow Jackets on Senior Night when York comes to the Klitgord Center on Friday night for the CUNYAC finale at 5:00 pm.

HUNTER

Lindsay Meltzer was stellar last week for Hunter in their pair of conference victories over York and New York City Tech. Meltzer averaged 16.5 points, 8.5 assists and 6.5 rebounds per game to go along with three steals per contest. Against York, the guard put in a 13 point, 8 assist effort and hit .500 from the floor. Versus New York City Tech, the senior was a key in the victory hitting 12-14 free throws (.857) as well as posting 20 points, nine assists and three steals.

LEHMAN

The Lehman College women's basketball team is coming off of a 3-0 week and have currently won 9 out of the last 10 games. The dynamic duo of senior guard Kathy Santiago and sophomore Sally Nnamani have begun to function as a lethal tandem. After scoring her 1,000 career point against New York City Tech, Santiago has been on a roll, averaging 22.2 points per game in the four contest following the milestone. Nnamani has been scoring at a torrid pace and is currently just 52 points shy of joining Santiago in the 1,000 point club. Junior Maria Loor has started to come on as of late for the Lightning, the 2005 CUNY Rookie of the Year is averaging 11.4 points per game in her last five contest.
